




Meet Two of L.A.'s Longest Service Employees







Bigger Machines, Smaller Costs

American Laundry/Prudential Overall

Ithough Prudential Overall Supply's Cerritos, Calif. facility received its new machines in winter 1996, the work on this washroom revitalization actually began in fall 1993. Stefan Schurter, VP of engineering and production at Prudential, says "We had developed some ideas and knew want we wanted-a larger-than 700-pound open pocket machine, not a tunnel. We liked a machine with a wide door and parts you could buy at the local hardware store. We wanted to be able to hook it up with a standard computer. We looked for one motor with a variable speed drive instead of a multi-motor clutch driven system." Schurter, with some other engineers, met with the staff of American Laundry Machinery, Inc. and they designed the 800-pound L-Tron to meet Prudential's needs.

The Cerritos plant is a dust-only operation that was reaching capacity in 1996. In California, land, energy, and labor are costly. Prudential decided to replace its entire washroom of six 700-pound machines, some only four years old, with five of the new 800-pound L-Trons.



The 800-pound L-Tron washers enable Prudential's Cerritos plant to process 400,000 pounds per day.



One immediate advantage was room for growth. The larger L-Trons had the same footprint as the smaller machines they replaced. Five new machines gave the company greater capacity and, literally, room to grow without new trench work in the spot where the last older machine stood. The configuration of the shuttle system already in place did not need to be reconfigured to fit the new machines. Prudential's own team completed the installation.

Schurter notes that there are several cost advantages to the larger machines, including a demonstrable savings in energy costs. "We process about 400,000 pounds of mats and towels in this plant. Based on previous experience, we calculated the return on investment for this change at about two years. Surprisingly, we recovered our costs in only 1.4 years."

The data showed considerable savings due to the new machines. "The loads are larger so we are able to wash more poundage in fewer machines. The washroom labor savings were good—from 18 hours to 13.5 average per day.

"But it was in the areas of water and energy that we really saved. Water cost dropped about 22 percent, because with the larger basket, you have increased agitation and are able to do more with less. This is especially important in California where water costs and sewer bills are high.

"Because of reduced flow, we saw a 14 percent reduction in our sewer costs and our wastewater treatment costs dropped by 13 percent. We still have the same amount of waste to treat, but the lower volume flow coming from these larger washers makes it easier to treat.

"The gas costs lowered by 10 percent thanks to the lower hot water requirements of the machine and the better extraction."


"Our biggest utility savings is electrical—a whopping 28 percent. Our previous washers had multiple motors accelerated by clutch action. Now, with one motor per machine and a variable speed drive, the flow of energy is more steady to power up and you don't have those current peaks that resulted in a premium charge before."

In addition to all of these measurable savings, Schurter notes the plant now spends less time on maintenance and mat repair—all of which he attributes to the new machines. "The single motor and lack of clutch mean less to maintain. The larger door makes it easier to load and unload the mats without tearing the edges so fewer need to be sent for repair."

Since using these first six the company has put over 20 of the L-Tron 800's in service in other plants and plans to install a seventh in Cerritos this spring. For Prudential bigger means better—especially when it comes to the company's bottom line.






